- Proficiency in quantitative analysis methods (Stata, R, etc.), preferably with experience or interest in secondary and/or longitudinal data analysis
- Strong motivation to complete a doctoral thesis and publish high-quality work
- Strong skills in writing and presenting findings (in English)
- Working languages: English and French. The research will be conducted in English. Further fluency in French can be acquired by participating in the free courses at the School of French as a Foreign language

- The position includes research for a doctoral thesis as well as joint research projects and participation in the activities of the department (70% of working time) and teaching assistance as an assistant in the classroom while the course is led by a senior academic (30%)
